Please provide examples.	Throughout 2019/20, the CCG looked to maximise spend, encouraging PCNs to bid for unspent Additional Roles Reimbursement (ARR) funds and supporting all bids made. We also offered with recruitment support and monthly shared with all Clinical Directors the latest position.  The CCG funded additional "parachuting" Clinical Pharmacists to support practices / PCNs in short term need of assistance due to staffing issues or inability to recruit. We were required to utilise this service much more than was budgeted for at the start of the year and thereby utilised the unspent ARR to support this additional workforce need.
